Why Sustainable Development Goals?

Today, we measure economic growth in terms of an increase in the production and consumption of goods and services. Its indicator, Gross Domestic Product (GDP), doesn't measure happiness or community. It doesn't guarantee fairness, justice, and social inequities and most importantly it ignores the environment. It's not concerned about the gap between rich and poor, or the loss of the ecosystem. That's why we see anger, frustration, conflict, and environmental disasters around the world.

Perhaps a better way to measure society and track progress is to measure if basic human needs are covered:

- 1) Do we have fair access to food (healthy food), water (clean water), shelter, and safety? Are we and our future generations safe from environmental destruction?
- 2) Do we have access to education, basic knowledge, and information? Do we have access to health and well-being? The basic Human Rights.
- 3) Opportunities Do we have rights and freedom? Do we live in societies in which we're not discriminated against? Do we have access to advanced education? Can we pursue our goals? Do we have equality, equity, and social mobility?

The UN Sustainable Development Goals will serve as an indicator of progress, instead of GDP.








